### **COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES:**

Comparative adjectives are used to **compare differences** between the two objects they modify (larger, smaller, faster, higher). They are used in sentences where two nouns are compared, in this pattern:

NOUN (subject)	VERB "To be"	COMPARATIV E adjective	THAN	NOUN (object)
She	is	tall <b>er</b>	than	me.

#### Other examples:

- Horses are faster than dogs.
- Trains are longer than buses.
- The night is darker than the day.
- The dog is **more energetic than** the elephant.

## **SUPERLATIVE ADJECTIVES:**

Superlative adjectives are used to describe an object which is at the upper or lower limit of a quality (the tallest, the smallest, the fastest, the highest). They are used in sentences where a subject is compared to a group of objects.

NOUN (subject)	VERB "To be"	Article	SUPERLATIVE adjective	NOUN (object)
She	is	the	tall <b>est</b>	in the class.

#### Other examples:

- The elephant is the heaviest.
- Summer is the hottest season.
- Harry and Peter are the nicest boys in the class.
- We are the **most intelligent** group of the contest.
